David Attisani is a partner in the firm’s Insurance & Reinsurance Group, one of the leading practices of its kind in the US, which is top-ranked by Reactions (#1 reinsurance and litigation firm in 2012) and by *The 2013 Legal 500* guide to preeminent law firms. He is also co-chairman of the ABA’s Reinsurance Subcommittee, and a member of the ARIAS-US Education Committee (2013-present).

Mr. Attisani was the first-ever Boston-area attorney to be recognized in the *Chambers USA* nationwide rankings for Insurance/Reinsurance (2014-2017). He was also elected to the *World’s Leading Insurance and Reinsurance Lawyers* (2006-2017).
